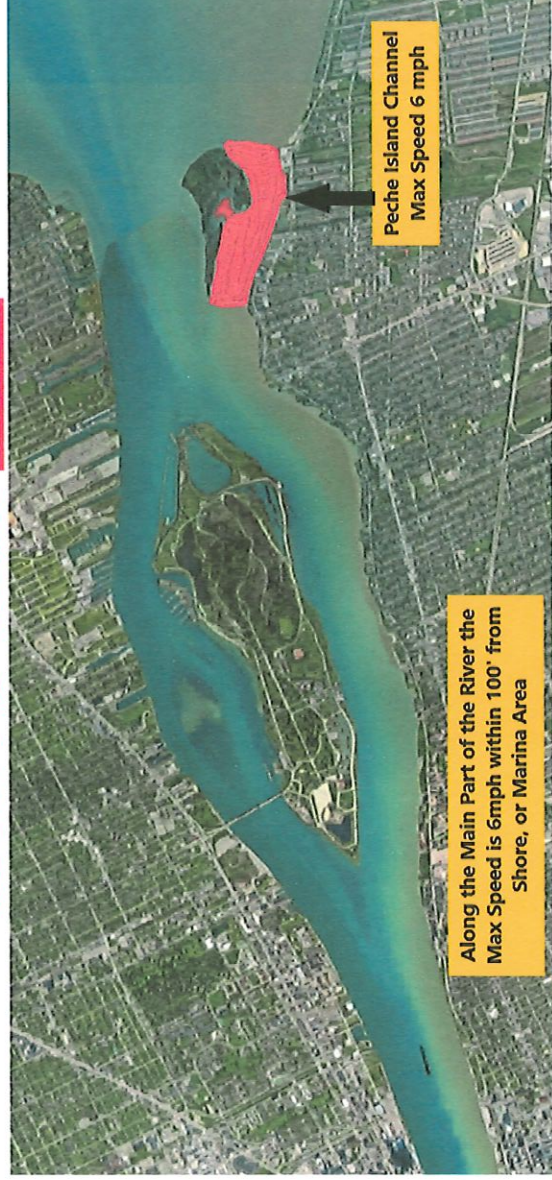
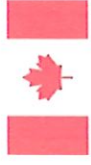

Other Laws and Requirements

United States citizens can cross at any time into Canadian waters as part of their passage without having to report to Customs. Once they cross the coastal plain and do any of the following:

- ✿ Enter coves, inlets, slips or behind commercial docks.
- ✿ Pick up passengers or goods in Canada.
- ✿ Tie to any Canadian structure, drop anchor in Canadian waters.
- ✿ Land at any part of the shoreline.

They are required to call into the Customs Border Services Agency at 1-888-226-7277.

- ✿ If Fishing in Canadian waters, A license is required and can be obtained by going to www.ontario.ca Search for “Fishing License-nonresidents of Canada.”
- ✿ While in Canadian waters, a boater may be boarded and inspected by any designated law enforcement agency whether federal, provincial, or municipal.
- ✿ Marijuana though legal in Michigan & Canada is still prohibited to be carried across the border and boaters are instructed to leave their Marijuana weed, gummies, edibles, or drinks at home. Typically, the offender would be told to leave Canadian waters but is subject to arrest, fine and seizure of their vessel.
- ✿ Alcohol can be carried if it is in a sealed container and secured away. If entering into Canada, the alcohol must be declared.
- ✿ Firearms and other weapons such as pepper spray, brass knuckles, spring activated knives etc. are **prohibited in Canada**. Again, at the discretion of the officer the vessel may be directed back to US waters and US authorities notified. However, the person in possession is subject to detention or arrest. **Important for firearm owners to ensure that they remember to remove their pistols and long guns out of their boat if at any time they are thinking of entering Canadian waters.**
